## **Section 3 Writing Prompts**

- 1. Write a song with four verses and each verse is about a different person in a family. Tie the verse together with a chorus that links each verse.
- 2. Write a song about measurements.
- 3. Have you ever had a car that you bonded with? What would you say to that car? What would you tell us about the car? Put it in a song
- 4. Write an advertising jingle to sell a product. Jingles usually have a very catchy melody that is very easy to remember. They usually talk about how good the product is. (Example The Nugrape Twins "I've Got an Ice Cold Nugrape <a href="https://youtu.be/eHRGXvfSu3s">https://youtu.be/eHRGXvfSu3s</a>)
- 5. Find a person who is not a songwriter and ask them what their favorite kinds of songs are. What themes do they like? What styles do they like? Slow songs? Fast songs? Dance Songs? Ballads? Etc. Write a song using their answers.
- 6. Do you love or hate you hometown? Tell us about it with a song.
